

TALKING SHREDDER



Batteries are included for demonstration purposes only and may need to be replaced by the consumer. Adult supervision is required to replace batteries.

To Change Batteries:

- · Unscrew battery cover.
- Take out old batteries and replace with 3 new AG13/LR44 batteries.
- · Replace battery cover.

Battery Instructions:

- Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.
- · Different types of batteries or new and used batteries are not to be mixed.
- Only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended are to be used.
- Batteries are to be inserted with the correct polarity.
- Exhausted batteries are to be removed from the toy.
- The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.
- Batteries are to be removed from the toys when not in use.
- · Batteries should only be replaced by an adult.
- · Do not dispose of batteries in fire.
- · Do not use rechargeable batteries.

Batteries Regulation: Do not mix old and new batteries. Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc), or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
